FREE DRESS DAY

Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) is a complex, lifelong developmental disability that affects a person's ability to communicate, interact with others and cope in everyday situations. The cause of ASD is not fully understood, but structured early intervention, therapy and education delivered by professionals with expertise in ASD can make a significant difference. At Beldon PS we work hand in hand with the Beldon Education Support Centre to support our students with ASD.

ANZAC DAY RECOGNITION

As ANZAC Day occurs during the school holidays this year, we will be holding a ceremony recognising its importance on the final day of term, Friday 12 April. The ceremony will be conducted by our Student Councillors with the guidance of Mr Williams.

This assembly is a wonderful way to reinforce that ANZAC Day is one of Australia's most important national commemorative occasions. It marks the anniversary of the first major military action fought by Australian and New Zealand forces during the First World War. On the 25 of April 1915, Australian and New Zealand soldiers formed part of the allied expedition that set out to capture the Gallipoli peninsula. These soldiers became known as ANZACs and the pride they took in that name continues to this day. With the coming of the Second World War, ANZAC Day also served to commemorate the lives of Australians who died in this battle. The meaning of ANZAC Day today includes the remembrance of all Australians killed in military operations.
