Bandanna Week



During Week 3, we will be selling Bandannas each day before school and during recess, outside the library.

Bandannas will cost \$7 each, cash or EFTPOS available (EFTPOS in the morning only) and students are invited to wear them throughout the week. All funds raised from selling bandannas will help young people impacted by cancer access Canteen programs, counselling and peer support.

Since 2017, Beldon Primary School has raised over \$10,000 for young people impacted by cancer. Bandanna Day is the flagship fundraising and awareness campaign for Canteen.



We are entering the Noongar season of Kambarang (Second Spring).

As we watch the landscape start to shimmer with 'sunshine yellow' blossom, we can feel the sun's warmth growing stronger again. The season of birth – Kambarang – is here, also referred to as the wildflower season, for good reason.

With the rising temperatures, we see the wattles (acacias), banksias, kangaroo paw, kara or djubak (orchids), verticordias and leschenaultias among others, burst into bloom. If the balgas have been previously burnt or closely shaved, they will also begin to flower!

With the slow waking of sleepy animals who have been hibernating throughout the colder months, there is also some wildlife to see. Firstly, this is the time when you are most likely to encounter a waakal (python) or yoorn (bobtail lizard). You will also hear the koolbardie's (magpie) babies crying out for their parents, it is the season of birth after all, and we all know they are very protective.

Traditionally, this is when the Noongar people would have moved towards the coast from the hills, searching for freshwater crayfish, frogs, and tortoises.

Although Kambarang is associated with the colour yellow, there is such a wide variety of other rich colours on display.



The most significant and striking flower you will see is the Moodjar, Western Australia's native Christmas tree, which flowers from late October to January.

This tree carries bright orange and yellow flowers and is spiritually significant to the Noongar people. Its bright colours indicate that the warm weather is heading our way.

Look what is happening in K5 and K6!

The students were challenged to design a structure commonly found in a town or city. We began by exploring the differences between rural and urban areas and discussing how humans have transformed the natural landscape in both.

As a class, we decided to focus on an urban environment.

Students brainstormed the types of structures you might find in a city and considered why some structures are more common than others. Working in groups, they chose what they wanted to create and researched construction techniques to support their designs.

Students then built their structures at home and brought them in last week — and the results are absolutely incredible!



B1 and B2 Excursion - AQUA

Pre-Primary students enjoyed a beautiful day at the Aquarium of Western Australia last week.

Students spent the day being inspired by the amazing living creatures that call our coastline home. This experience will support our classroom learning throughout the term.

Their highlights included holding starfish and touching sharks in the touch pool, watching a scuba diver feed the fish through the underwater tunnel, and, most of all, spending a day out of school with their friends.

A big thank you to the parent volunteers who came along — your support is truly appreciated and helps to enrich the students' learning experiences.














Keeping your child safe online

We can help our children safely navigate the online world by taking some basic steps to reduce the risks.

Be engaged, open and supportive

- Get involved in your child's online world play games together, talk about their favourite apps and websites, and keep communication open.
- Encourage them to share their online experiences and reassure them they can always come to you if something feels wrong.
- Reassure your child they can always come to you, no matter what. Your child may not
 communicate openly about things that worry them online if they fear being in trouble if they
 tell you. Let them know you will not cut off internet or device access if they tell you they are
 feeling uncomfortable or unsafe online.
- If you notice changes in their behaviour or mood, have a conversation and seek support from a GP, psychologist or school counsellor if needed.

- Arrival Time: Students arriving before 8.30am must wait in the atrium unless accompanied by an adult.
- Jewellery: For safety reasons, no jewellery (other than small stud earrings) should be worn at school.
- Uniform: Please ensure students are in correct school uniform no bike shorts.


