Kitchen Garden Project

Students at Beldon are incredibly fortunate to have access to both our school garden and industrial kitchen. Over the years, these much-loved programs have evolved and been supported by many dedicated staff members.

Currently, our garden is cared for by Mrs Lun, who works with us each Tuesday morning. Mrs Lun has a long-standing connection to our school—both of her adult sons attended Beldon—and she brings a wealth of gardening knowledge. Under her expert guidance, the garden has flourished, with its produce even winning multiple awards at the Wanneroo Show.

This term, students from M3 and M5 have been making the most of their time in the garden with Susanne, learning about growing fresh produce and connecting with nature. K3 and K4 have now started their garden sessions and will continue each week until the end of term, followed by K5 and K6 later in the year.

As part of this program, each class also participates in a cooking session at the end of their time in the garden. These sessions, led by Mrs Brown and held in our school's industrial kitchen (located in the ESC), use vegetables harvested straight from our garden.















This week, M5 had their turn in the kitchen and did a fantastic job preparing sweet potato frittata and pumpkin scones—using pumpkins grown right here at school. The students thoroughly enjoyed the experience, with many surprised by how tasty pumpkin scones can be!

Year 5 & 6 Incursion

Today, our Year 5 and 6 students took part in an exciting graffiti art incursion The workshop immersed the students in the world of contemporary art, focusing specifically on graffiti as a powerful form of creative expression.

Have you noticed the new project that has started between the greenhouse and our chickens?

Construction of a Yarning Circle has commenced and we are so excited to have this amazing space taking shape on our school grounds. A Yarning Circle is a traditional Aboriginal meeting place where people come together as a community to meet and share stories and knowledge.

Our school Yarning Circle is being designed in collaboration with Tae-shan and Wiremu, BPS parents. Tae and Wiremu have begun leveling the earth to make way for the log seating that will be placed in a circle around the outside of this space. We have received grants and donations that will provide around 300 plants for around the Yarning Circle and a limestone path. Log seating is being sourced currently.

Once completed the Yarning Circle will be a welcoming space for students, staff and community to gather.


