Thank you to all the families who took the time to complete the School Opinion Parent Survey. We greatly value your feedback as it helps us celebrate what is working well and identify areas where we can continue to improve.

The results below provide valuable insights into the experiences and perceptions of our school community. We appreciate your honesty and willingness to share your thoughts. Your feedback will help inform our future planning and ensure we continue to provide the best possible learning environment for all students.

You said, we did

You said: You wanted more opportunities for your children to participate in clubs and extracurricular activities.

We did: We introduced a range of clubs and activities, including Breakfast Club, Cricket Club, Choir, Gardening Club, school councillor's running lunchtime activities such as netball skills, dress ups and Mindfulness Club.

You said: We need to listen more to parents' opinions.

We did: We have scheduled a termly Parent Forum to provide families with a regular opportunity to share feedback and ideas. First meeting Thursday 6th August at 8.45 in the boardroom. We will also be seeking parent feedback following school events to better understand what is working well and where we can improve.

You said: We need more Education Assistants to support students, particularly those with additional learning needs such as ADHD and dyslexia.

We are doing: We agree that targeted support is important for students who require additional assistance. Unfortunately, Education Assistant allocations are largely determined by disability funding provided for eligible students, and schools are unable to independently increase staffing beyond available funding.

While we cannot always provide additional Education Assistants, we are committed to ensuring students receive the support they need. We are continuously upskilling our teachers and Education Assistants through professional learning and are working closely with specialists and allied health professionals to tailor support strategies for individual students. This helps us provide effective classroom adjustments and targeted interventions that support student learning and wellbeing.

Learning Journeys

We are looking forward to welcoming parents and carers to our Learning Journey on **Wednesday 24 June from 8:45am to 10:00am.**

The Learning Journey provides families with the opportunity to visit classrooms, celebrate student learning and gain a deeper understanding of the teaching and learning that takes place at Beldon Primary School each day.

A Learning Journey is all about students sharing their learning. Your child will proudly guide you through activities, explain their work and showcase the knowledge and skills they have been developing throughout the term.

There will also be a fun Scavenger Hunt for families to complete as they explore the school. Follow the clues, work out the answers, and return your completed entry to your child's class teacher to go into the draw to win a small prize.

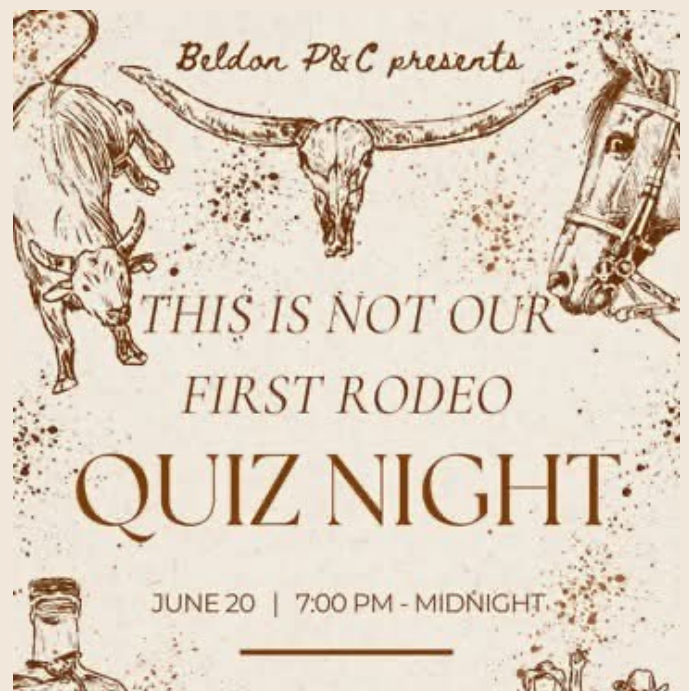
- Doors open at 7:00pm be sharp - the sheriff will be monitoring!

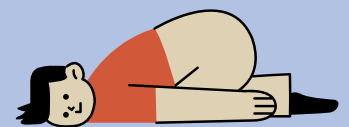

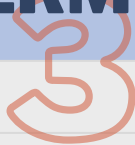
