We appreciate the support of our families in helping children arrive at school on time and ready to learn each day.

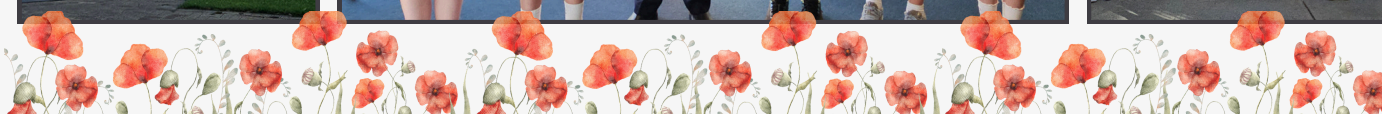
ANZAC Day service

Celebrating Students

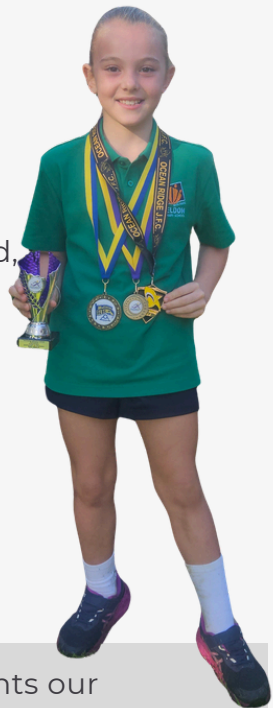
We are incredibly proud to share the outstanding sporting achievements of **Rylee**, who has had a remarkable season across multiple clubs and disciplines.

A big thank you to Ms Wigmore for leading such an engaging session - we look forward to many more learning opportunities in our beautiful new yarning circle!

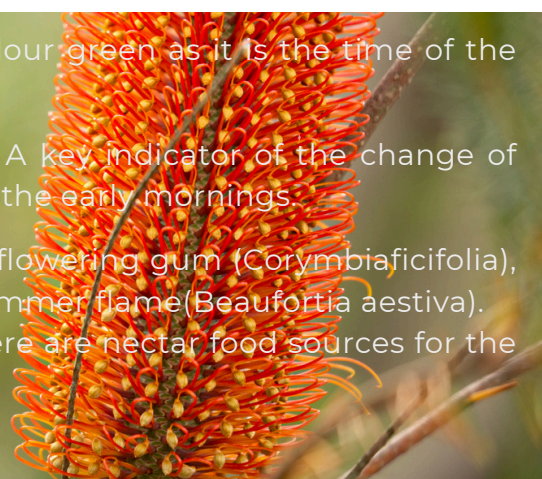


Welcome to Djeran (April-May)

The Noongar Season 'Djeran' is represented by the colour green as it is the time of the year where the cooler weather begins.

Djeran season sees a break in the really hot weather. A key indicator of the change of season is the cool nights that bring a dewy presence in the early mornings.

Djeran is a time of red flowers, especially from the red flowering gum (*Corymbia ficifolia*), as well as the smaller and more petite flowers of the summer flame (*Beaufortia aestiva*). Banksias start to display their flowers, ensuring that there are nectar food sources for the many small mammals and birds that rely upon them.

Waste Sorted

We are proud to share that our school has been awarded Waste Sorted accreditation for 2026. This achievement recognises our strong commitment to sustainability and the collective efforts of our students, staff and wider school community.

Our Waste Sorted plan focuses on reducing, reusing, and recycling. We are minimising paper use through digital practices, conducting regular waste audits, composting organic waste, feeding scraps to our school chickens, and reducing single-use items - significantly cutting down what we send to landfill.

Later this year, students will take part in a Waste Sorted incursion, and our senior students will conduct a waste audit. We are also excited to participate in Plastic Free July for the first time, followed by another audit to measure our impact.

SCHOOL DENTAL SERVICE, IT'S TIME TO ENROL!

Every year Dental Health Services (DHS) offers parents and carers the chance to register their kids for free dental care at the School Dental Service (SDS). The offer is open to every student from the year they turn 5 until their 17th birthday and includes check-ups, fillings, and simple extractions.

Your child will soon bring home an envelope with an enrolment form, Frequently Asked Questions, and reply-paid envelope from DHS. Just fill in the enrolment form, pop it in the reply-paid envelope, and put it in your nearest post box.

Once we receive your form at DHS our team will register your child and arrange for you to receive an appointment in the mail.
