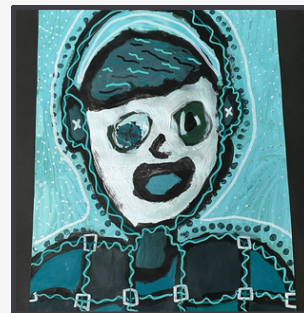
We appreciate the support of our families in helping children arrive at school on time and ready to learn each day.

K3 and K4 have been working incredibly hard on their monochromatic acrylic paintings, exploring how to use different shades and tones of a single colour to create depth and interest. Students have been learning how to mix paints carefully, control their brush strokes and experiment with light and dark contrasts to bring their ideas to life.

Meanwhile, **Mikala** brought home three trophies from her recent dance competition, a wonderful reward for her hard work and passion.





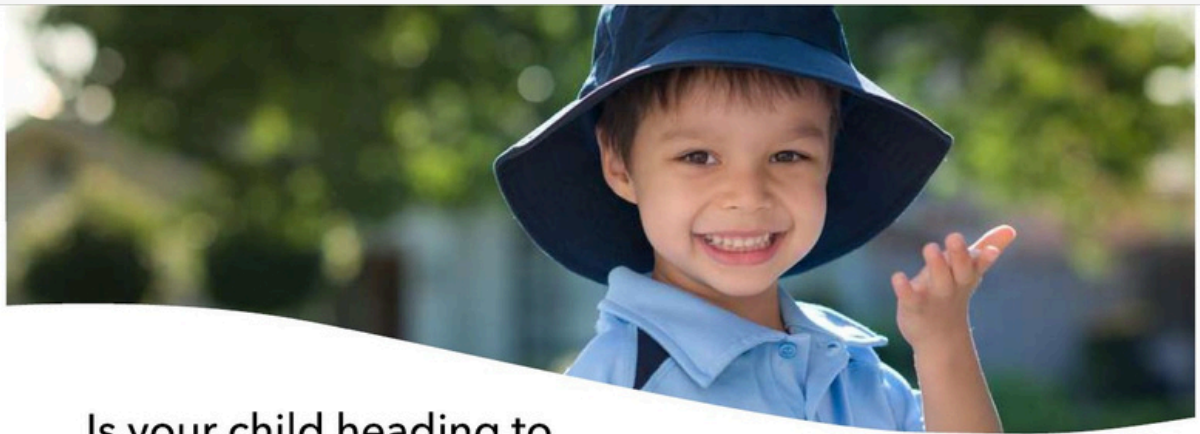
